



**BMX Sports Western Australia  
Super Series 2011/12  
Scoring Guidelines**

- The following guidelines are to be used for scoring at Super Series events and read in conjunction with “Super Series Criteria 2011/12”
- Riders will be scored 1 – 8, according to their position crossing the finish line.
- In the event of there not being any Transponder timing devices in operation, scorers must score according to the placing allocated to each rider as per the Score Slip, supplied by the Race Recorder, unless authorised otherwise by the Race Commissar or Race Director, who will sign the bail slip accordingly.
- If a nominated competitor does not start in their moto, then the race sheet is marked “DNS” (did not starter) for that moto. “DNS” scores maximum points based on a full gate start (8 points).
- If a rider starts but does not finish in a race, then the race sheet is marked “DNF” (did not finish) for that moto. “DNF” will score equal to the number of riders who started in the moto.
- A rider must be scored in at least 1 moto in order to use an event as a qualifier. Rides with DNS results will not be included as a qualifier.
- The results for any semi-finals held, must be entered onto the scoring sheet as riders who race in any semi-final will have that result added to their scores when the results are compiled for the Super Series.
- Any run offs required will be determined by fastest lap time attained in the 3<sup>rd</sup> moto. If the time is equal then the 2<sup>nd</sup> moto times will be used and so forth. In the event that riders cannot be split then a run off will be run.
- The Race sheets and Officiating Report will remain the property of BMX Sports Western Australia. Records will be archived as per best business practice.
- All Nomination Forms, Race Result / Run Sheets, Moto Draw Sheets will remain the property of BMX Sports WA.

- i) Points will be awarded for all motos (including semi finals, finals and extra motos).
- ii) A rider who qualifies shall only count their best 8 results towards the Super Series. In the event of a tie the riders overall positions will be decided by count back.



Notwithstanding anything contained in the current UCI BMX Rules and Australian Procedures Manual (As Amended) the following rules apply to the "Super Series 2011/12"

**1. Scoring System:**

iii) Race Points are gained as per the following:

- 1<sup>st</sup> – 8pts
- 2<sup>nd</sup> – 7pts
- 3<sup>rd</sup> – 6pts
- 4<sup>th</sup> – 5pts
- 5<sup>th</sup> – 4pts
- 6<sup>th</sup> – 3pts
- 7<sup>th</sup> – 2pts
- 8<sup>th</sup> – 1pt

2. Riders must compete in Eight (8) out of the ten (10) events, of which two (2) must be country, to qualify for the 2011/12 Super Series.
3. Series Awards will be presented for:
  - i) Experts – Plate and Trophy plus a Super Series Ranking 1 – 8
  - ii) Novices – Trophy (novices will not be ranked)
  - iii) Sprockets – Participation Trophy
  - iv) Teams – Trophy 1 – 3

*Event Awards will be accumulative series style Trophy/Plaque supplied by BMX Sports Western Australia.*

4. The events will be run as novice and expert classes. Exception is 8-year class where there will not be a distinction between novice and expert. Novices may choose to move up to Expert at any time of the series but cannot carry their points with them. Re-Classification procedures apply for Novices who wish to transfer back from Expert Class. Novice classes will cease once a rider is classified as 17yrs of age.
5. All riders should remain in the same class for the entire season. Exception to this rule: when there is no class for the rider and he/she rides up a class; when the novices and experts are combined; or for females who race with the males. The points scored will be carried over to correct age class for rider (ie. if rider comes third then the points scored will be carried over).
6. Novices ranked in the top 16 at the State Championships and/or who are placed in the top three (3) for the Super Series will automatically go to Expert Status for the following season. Further Riders placing in the top three (3) of the Northwest Championships will also be required to race as an Expert. Election of the rider or at the direction of the Race Director may also elevate a novice to expert status. Riders who must transfer to Expert will be published on the BMX Sports Western Australia web site.
7. The top eight (8) expert riders only, may display their ranking for the following year.
8. All events will be run as age at 31 Dec 2012 *Inc Sprockets. Amendments to ARA Regional Applications as at 1<sup>st</sup> January 2010.*

9. There will be seven (7) events in the metropolitan area and three (3) in the country. There will be **NO** bonus points allocated for the 2011/12 series. However Rd2 in Karratha will be contested over 4 motos and Finals. Riders will score points for ALL races effectively acquiring a bonus of between 36 to 50 points dependant on race position.
10. The Scoring Sheets and Officiating Report and will be handed to the designated Race Director immediately on completion of the event, who will send them to BMX Sports Western Australia immediately after the event. *(these will always remain the property of BMX Sports Western Australia)*
11. “Pro Open” money class is open to all riders who have reached 14 years of age for both male and female. Pro Open riders wishing to enter the Open Men’s / Ladies class will be entered at no extra charge, and in the interest of fairness to all competitors will be required to participate in all semi finals and finals at each race meeting. These Open Men’s / Woman’s class will be scored using UCI transfer system.
12. Pro Open Money class will be required to participate in a final series if the entries are nine or more, consisting of three races. Placing 1-8 and 9-16 will be determined on accumulated points at the end of the three race finals. Prize money breakdown to be determined by BMX Sports Western Australia.  
  
In the event that the Pro Open class attracts less than 20 riders then only 12 riders will transfer to the semi finals as per ARA rules. Only these 12 riders will be eligible to contest the 3 final finals. “A” final will consist of 8 riders and the “B” final will consist of 4 riders only. Prize money allocated to positions 5 to 8 in the “B” final will revert back to the series promoter.
13. BMX Sports Western Australia as the series promoter will provide a minimum of \$1200 to Pro Open classes. Vet pro cruiser (30+) will attract a prize pool of \$200 plus payback of \$5.00 per rider entered.
14. Riders will only be eligible to enter one (1) money class event per round. Log Booked riders will not be permitted to return to voucher classes.
15. Prizes will be provided by BMX Sports Western Australia for the nominated voucher classes.
16. It will be the responsibility of *BMX Sports Western Australia* to organise the scoring. BMX Sports Western Australia approved computer scoring program must be used for all super series events. (“BMX Event Manager” by Lyndon Downing) in conjunction with the MyLaps Transponder systems.
17. Riders entering the Series after the second (2<sup>nd</sup>) round must nominate in a class that has already been subscribed in the previous rounds. Classes will not be created after round 2. Classes offered at the start of the series are as attached and form part of the entry criteria.
18. These regulations and guidelines form part of the event nominations. Further supplementary regulations deemed appropriate will be published no later than 14 days prior to the event and are to be attached to the event nomination forms and available with the online nominations.
19. Unless a Pro Open class attracts a minimum of 16 riders at an event, a consolation final WILL NOT be run. A 3 heat final will still be run for an entry of 9 or more riders.

20. As this series will be scored using MyLaps Transponder Systems, all riders are required to have a transponder (as allocated or owned) affixed to the front right hand fork as close to the wheel axle as practical. It will be the riders sole responsibility to ensure that the CORRECT transponder is affixed to their bike. **Failure to adhere to this will result in the rider not being credited with having competed in the race.**
- Riders will need to attend registration at each event to collect their assigned transponder details.
  - Once the rider has been assigned a transponder they will then be required to attend the Transponder collection and fitting station. There will be assistance available for those that require it. Once the transponder is fitted to the bike the rider must pass over the detection loop to verify that the transponder is in working order and has been assigned correctly.
  - In the event of the rider owning their own transponder they are still required to attend registration. It is then recommended that they still attend the fitting station to verify that there details are correct.
  - If a rider has changed bike for whatever reason they need to fit their allocated transponder to that bike. If a bike is shared then the scorers must be notified in sufficient time for the details to be amended prior to them competing in there next race.
  - Hired transponders will be collected at the conclusion of the final race. **Failure to return the Hire transponder will incur a charge equal to the purchase price of a new transponder.**
  - A collection station will be set up to return transponders for those riders not participating in the finals.
  - Transponders will NOT be allocated to sprocket riders.
