PRESIDENTS REPORT

2016 is looking to be another successful year for BMX in Western Australia. From grass roots participation and membership to coaching and officiating, to entries at our State Super Series, State Championships and Olympic selection, we have seen success across the board.

EVENTS

Our events calendar continues with 9 of our 10 race State Super Series in 2016 being held already at the time going to print. Western Australia missed out hosting a round of the BMX Australia National Series in 2017 and is looking forward to being a successful host in 2018. Our Super Series continues to see strong entries across all age groups, in particular the mini wheelers with 15-20 at each event as well as 60-75 sprockets consistently through the year. National Championships headed east to Bathurst with a number of Western Australian riders on the podium.

The 2016 State Championships has attracted record numbers of over 700 entries, being held this year at Westside BMX Club in Balcatta over 3 days in October.

On a more social level, our end of year's awards ceremony in December heads to Adventure World in Bibra Lake. Feedback on the event last year was overwhelmingly positive.

CLUB DEVELOPMENT

Developing further on the OSM online events system, we have added our Volunteer Officials Roles for each event online. As part of qualifying for our end of year awards, riders must have a volunteer job registered against their name. By putting this online, it has allowed Parents/guardians to also be a part of BMX – with them ensuring they are a level 1 Official and also have a volunteer licence, they can now also log on and choose the job they wish to do and the event they wish to complete it at. The uptake has been fantastic with over 99% of most event volunteer positions filled within hours of it going live online.

COACHING

With the consolidation of the Beginners Coaching course, to date we have 18 newly accredited Beginner Coaches. Some of these coaches are also aspiring to further their training by moving to the next level of becoming a BMX Level 1 accredited coach, which will take place in 2017. Our aim for BMX and the clubs is to be able to have a minimum number of coaches in every club to be able to service the number of new and existing riders coming through. It is great to be able to offer all members training and coaching, as well as racing.

We are also in the early stages of investigating a “coach the coaches” program – with coach mentoring and professional development workshops a feature.

ELECTRONIC MEDIA

With regard to the electronic media, BMXWA continues to maintain Facebook as a key platform in our online and social media, where up to the minute information on races, links to results, videos and all things BMX locally and internationally are posted regularly. To date we have 1089 ‘likes’ to the page which is a 43% increase since 1 July 2015. Of interest is the most popular demographic of these likes at the 35-44 age group. We can assume from this statistic that parents of riders and older riders re-entering the sport are accessing information provided on Facebook, as opposed to the riders themselves. In addition race day videos of the Super Series are being posted via You Tube by the PerthBMX Channel. BMX Sports WA is also active on Twitter with 112 followers to date.

ATHLETE DEVELOPMENT

With the ongoing development of this program, we saw 22 members being selected for the State Squads for 2015/16. Travelling to some of the events as a squad together was definitely a learning curve for all of us. Invitations from the National Development Academy Coaches meant some of our Athletes were able to learn and experience what it is like to train and practice at the Elite level. The BMXWA Board have also developed High Performance and Athlete Development Strategy for implementation in the second half of 2016. The strategy is a guideline to assist with the implementation of the High Performance and Athlete Development Squads, and to assist in developing a successful and sustainable High Performance and Athlete Development program. The benefits of the High Performance Strategy are offered by BMX Sports Western Australia as an investment in an athlete to help them to meet the aims of the program. The strategy will be driven predominately from the board but also in partnership with the State Coach, and advisory group and the CEO.

In addition our riders performed admirably on the world stage in particularly our Elite riders in the UCI BMX Supercross World Cup. Lauren Reynolds had a very consistent year with an overall 7th place in the Elite Women (up from 9th in 2015). We were also thrilled to learn of Lauren's selection to her 2nd Olympic Games in Rio. This marks the 5th WA athlete to represent Australia at the Olympics. Meanwhile Kirsten Dellar also improved her UCI ranking in 2016.

BMX MINI WHEELERS

BMX Mini-Wheelers are continuing to achieve great success at clubs and refinement of the format has seen this grow to a legitimate class for all clubs throughout the state. To date WA has over 270 registered mini wheelers, some participating in rounds of the Super Series and also featured at the State Championships. Of note is the specially designed mini-wheeler start gate which holds 4 riders and comes complete with a foot controlled starting mechanism.



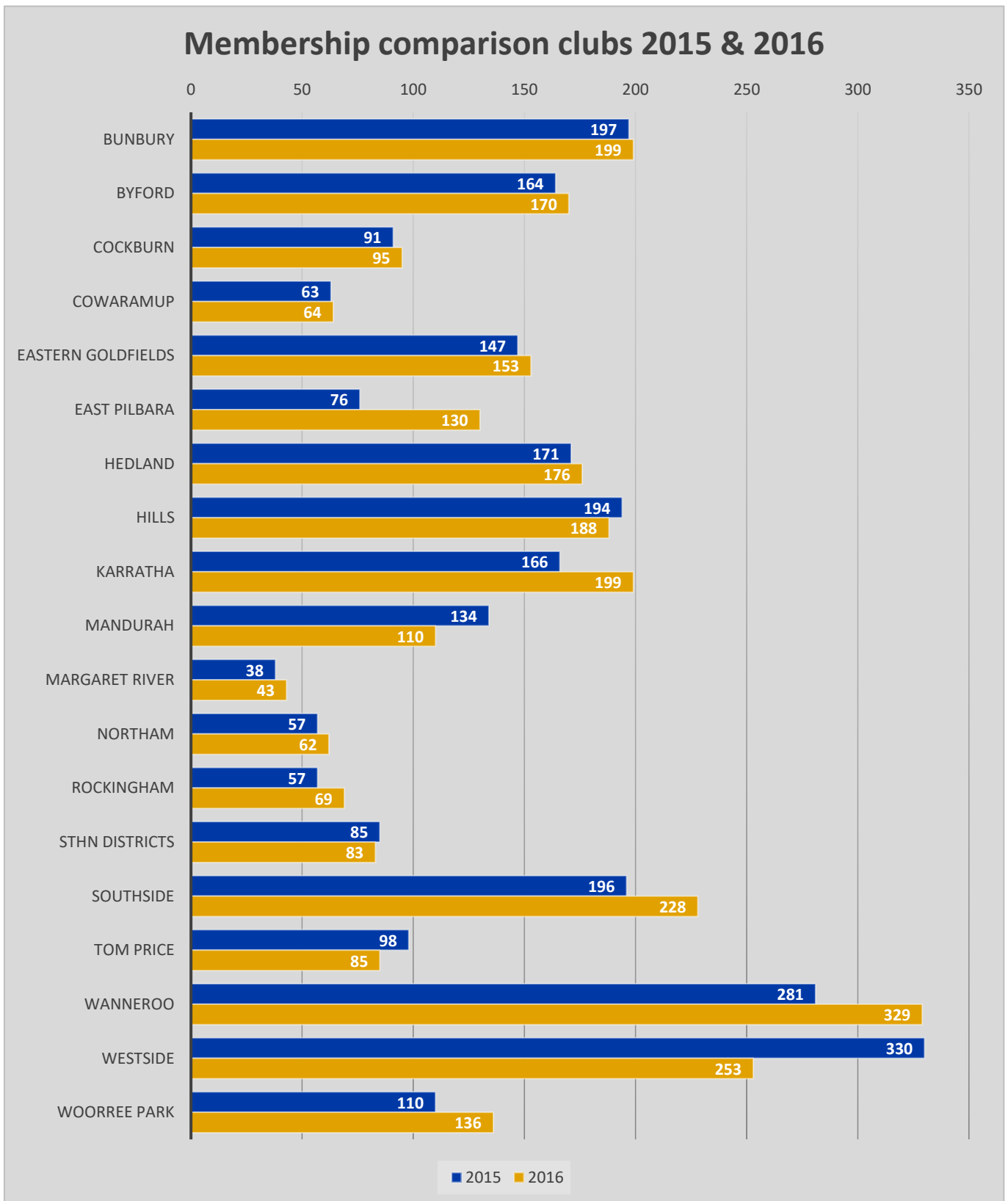

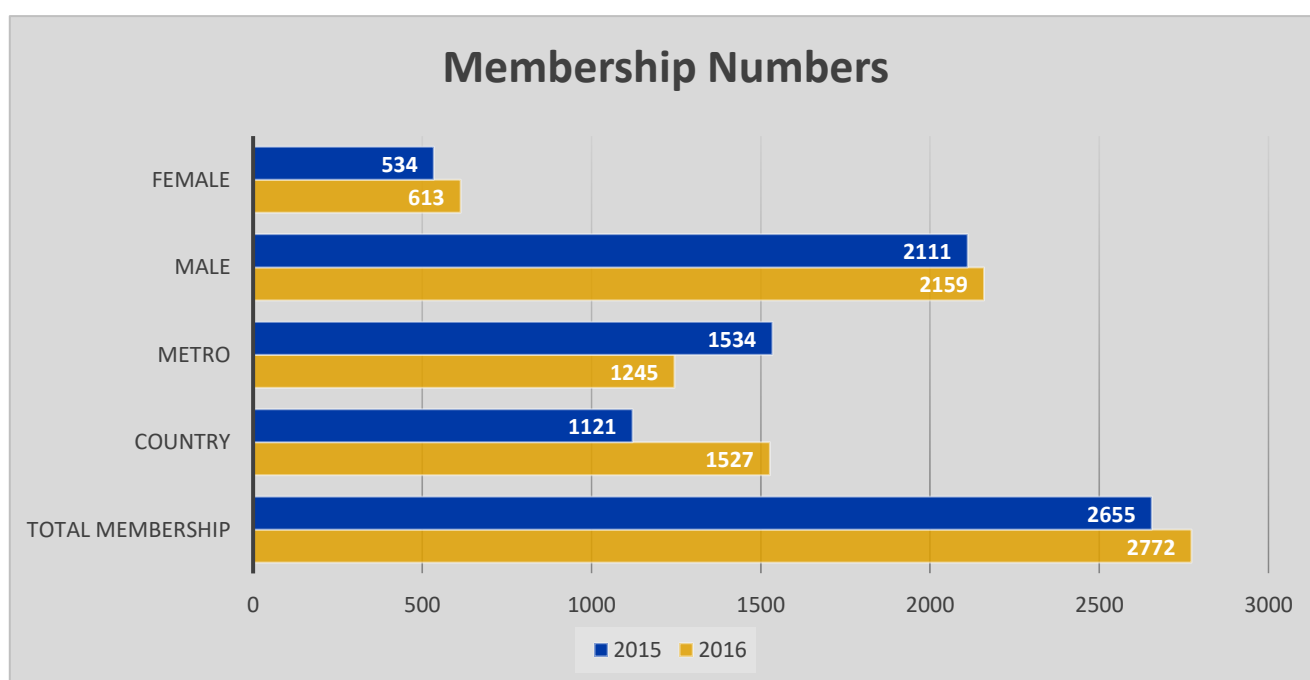

EVENT REPORT

National Series 2016

The 2016 season kicked off with rounds 1 & 2 of the BMX Australia National Series heading off to the traditional host track at Nerang in Queensland. A group of 24 WA athletes ranging from 14 years and over making the trip to the east for the first big race of the year. Nerang turned on some very warm weather, along with the high humidity in typical Queensland style. Day 1 saw 3 riders from WA on the podium, with more to come on the 2nd day. Some bad crashes saw a couple of WA riders off the track for the rest of the weekend. Kyle Hill took out 3rd place on day 1 in the 16 Boys Class, Dylan Bennetts 3rd place in 15 Boys, Corey Taylor 3rd Place in 14 Boys. Day 2 and WA had 2 athletes on the podium, Kesia Savill 3rd place in 17+ Women and Corey Taylor held onto 3rd again in 14 Boys.

The BMX Australia National Series allows the 14 and over age group of riders to race in a standalone series (7 rounds this year) around the country in the months prior to National Championships. Events are classed as C1 or CC UCI events which also allows International riders to compete and give the Australian riders a taste of what is out there around the World.

Cairns played host to rounds 3 & 4, and again we saw some very warm weather. A smaller group of 18 WA athletes headed to the east coast to again try their luck. With around 189 entries, the races were going to run through quickly, so all riders had to be on their game. Day 1 and we had over half of the field of WA athletes making it into the top 8 positions. Day 2 and WA again had a strong presence with 8 athletes making it into the finals.

Rounds 5 & 6 saw WA riders again making the long haul to the east coast, this time heading to Shepparton BMX Club in Victoria. With 193 riders in the field, 15 of those were from WA. On the first day WA had 9 riders in the top 8 and then day 2 we had 11 into the top 8.

Round 7 was held at the newly completed track at Bathurst, and was to set the stage in a warm up of what was to come for the National Championships in the days after. With numbers jumping up to 250 plus riders for this event, WA saw a total of 39 riders enter the final round of the National Series for the year. Making the top 8 in the last round were no less than 13 of WA riders.

Congratulations to all WA athletes who made the journey to the east coast for the BMX Australia National Series.

WA will continue to bid for rounds of the National Series each year to bring the high class event to WA, allowing all WA riders the chance to race against some of the best athletes in BMX. With the high cost of travel to the east coast, WA will also look for travel sponsorship opportunities in the years to come. The National Series is a stepping stone in the BMX pathway to gain valuable results, and for riders looking to gain selection into the National Squads.

National Championships

2016 was off to the east coast at the newly built track in Bathurst (right near Mt Panorama racing track) Riders and their families headed off in droves across the border, some making the trip by car, others choosing to go by plane. We saw a big number of WA families convoy into the Mt Panorama grounds in Winnebago's this year, something you had to see to believe.

With over 3000 entries across the event it was on for young and old. The track was not like anything most WA riders had ridden on before, those that got there a few days early had the chance to try it out before the main event.

It was an action packed week starting off with the Pre National events, followed by Crackerjack and Dynamites and then the last round of the National Series. After a few puncture repairs and lots of long walks back up the side of the hill from the finish line the National Championships were underway. With a somewhat altered format on the first day of National Championships racing, riders got on with the task at hand and battled it out on the track.

The remainder of the weekend saw many thrills and spills and a whole lot of action. Our riders put in a huge effort and did WA proud with 45 riders bringing home National plates. Overall it was a great week of racing at an amazing facility and congratulations to all WA riders who represented our State at the event.

State Super Series 2016

The State Super Series for 2016 took off in January, with Southern Districts hosting round 1. The BMX Sports Western Australia Super Series is part of a 10 round series for 2016. With a big year planned for riders to travel around the State to gain valuable experience and racing against the best riders in WA.

With all clubs now having the facilities to run transponders timing systems for the electronic scoring, riders could gain valuable gate start reaction times and full lap times at each club they raced at. Most riders have now purchased their own personal transponders which are used at all events around Australia now.

Uploading throughout the day, the race details and times are on hand and available with smart phone or tablets. For those without these facilities manual sheets are still used to allow riders to view their start order for motos and then through to the finals.

Another year saw once again a dedicated group of officials and an even bigger group of parent/guardian volunteers assist throughout the year to make sure all events are run smoothly. Their valuable help at these events goes without saying, the events would not run without them.

Online nominations have almost completely done away with the old manual paperwork, allowing a fast instant way to enter the events for all riders, giving them an instant receipt, and also to view other riders entered in the same race.

BMXWA continued to see growth in numbers across all rounds of the State Super Series, with numbers increasing hugely in our sprocket and mini wheeler classes in the past few years.

With the assistance of the online nomination system for Volunteers to enter as well, we have seen above 96% take the opportunity to enter online for their required volunteer jobs throughout the year. The online volunteer event can list all available positions for a race day and enable members to select one of them and lock it in prior to the event. The volunteer jobs form part of the criteria for riders to qualify at the end of the year awards ceremony. All level 1 and above officials can now register their interest online with ease.

Continued training on the computer scoring program BEM and transponders, along with upskilling officials to Level 2 accreditation happens throughout the year at events around the State.

All Clubs that have hosted a round of the State Super Series this year have done an exceptional job, and should be congratulated. The hours of track and facility preparation is enormous. Running of the canteens to enable good healthy food at all events is another mammoth task on the day and in preparation beforehand.

The final round for the year will see riders head to Byford in November, before the annual Awards Ceremony in December to crown the State Super Series winners for the year. 2017 will be another very busy year for National rounds all being held on the east coast and National Championships heading back to Sleeman in Brisbane will see a host of WA riders vying for a top position in order to gain selection for the World Championships, being held in RockHill USA mid-year.



2016 State Championships

Westside BMX Club would play host to the 2016 State Championships in October. With a record number of over 700 entries this was going to be an exciting few days for riders to gain their State Championships trophies. Again the event moved to the second week school holidays, so as not to clash with the AFL grand final. Holding the event over the Thursday, Friday and Saturday allowed some time for country riders and families to travel back home for a schools start on the Monday morning.

Westside BMX Club are not new at hosting large scale events, with National Series hosted previously and State Championships hosted a few years prior. The track was booked out for months before the State Championships, allowing riders to dial in the track prior to the big event.

With two Pre State events hosted by Westside the week before the big event, it gave riders another chance to spend some time on the track. Thursday official practice and registration was just the start of the 3 day event.

With the weather forecast not looking promising, everyone had to wait and see if the bureau of meteorology was going to be correct. Riders, Officials and families were pre prepared with umbrellas and wet weather gear just in case. Predictions of 100km an hour winds were also playing on the minds of the event managers.

Day 1 of the event came around and we were lucky enough not to have the high winds, and missed out on most of the bad weather. With the opening ceremony ready to go, and VIP's in place including members of local government, sports departments and local universities, we were treated to the Welcome to Country ceremony by Shane Garlett, next on the schedule was local singing talent Paris Sparks who sang a beautiful version, backed by her guitar of the National Anthem. With the formalities over and the event officially opened by local City of Stirling Councillor, David Boothman it was time to get the proceedings underway.

A total of 22 Mini Wheelers kicked off the day, with riders ranging in age from 2 – 4 years, we were all in for a treat. Helmets sometimes bigger than they are and making their way around a small part of the track on their balance bikes with valuable encouragement from parents, they would steal the hearts of all the crowd. Cameras were flashing from all points of the track.

Mini Wheelers are now a major part of BMX Racing in WA and Australia, they are the grassroots starting point for bike riding. And no we didn't make them go down the big start ramp.

With the youngest group of our riders done, it was time for their trophy presentations, they were ushered off the track. Time for a quick drink and they were ready to accept their trophies. We enlisted the help of some of our VIP's, Associate Professor, Chris Abiss from ECU University in Joondalup, PHD Candidate Lynne Munro also from ECU in Joondalup and Joe McCarthy High Performance Manager at Westcycle to present the Mini Wheeler awards. They received their gold cups with pride (some even wanted the chocolate frog inside the cup more than the trophy itself) Again cameras flashing from all points, it was utter chaos trying to get the little ones to sit still long enough for mum and dad to get the award winning shots.

Record numbers of 89 Sprockets (5-7 years) and Cruisers ranging in age from 8 to over 50 would be next to hit the track, full speed ahead for the race day ahead. Riders from around the State had travelled to enter the pinnacle of BMX in Western Australia and race for that number one spot.

Numbers for the junior classes continue to rise not only at State Championships but throughout the year at Club meets and Super Series events. With no other sport that a child can start from the age of 2 years it is a fantastic way to start off their young life riding a bike, with the dream of maybe one day leading to the Olympics.

Cruisers on the gate, and for some riders it would give them the chance to dial in the track for another day ahead of the main twenty inch classes on Saturday. With the weather holding off slightly, great battles were fought all day in the bigger wheeled cruiser classes. The older age classes also put on a fantastic show, racing as hard in the finals as they ever had before to look forward to taking home the coveted number one trophy.

The race day was ended off with trophies being presented to all sprocket and cruiser classes and it was time for the winning smiles to come out for their photo sessions.

The second day of racing saw the weather turn for the worst. Unfortunately due to the weather the parade of riders had to be cancelled, fingers crossed for next year, as clubs march loud and proud in their club colours to win the Best Presented Club Award.

The Best Represented Club award for the second year in a row went to Hills BMX Club. Congratulations Hills. Next on the program was the 10/15 year awards. Again with another star studded line up of riders, that have completed State Championships in consecutive years. What an excellent achievement.

The age class twenty inch riders were next to hit the track, with all eyes waiting to see the Elite riders soaring over the Pro straight. The ramp is high and the track is challenging for all age groups, which was going to bring out the best of the best in WA riders at the end of the day, even though the weather wasn't always in the riders favour.

With well over 100 volunteers and officials used throughout the weekend, a big thankyou to everyone involved.

A new camera system was introduced by BMX Sports Western Australia at the beginning of the year, this was set to ensure no double up 1st places recorded again this year. The main camera operates by movement and means as soon as riders cross the finish line it records their placings. This system is used around Australia and the world for all different types of sport. Instant confirmation of a photo finish from the scoring room prints directly through to the camera room, allowing the operator to view the footage and confirm placings to scoring immediately. Electronic timing also

locked and ready to go so everyone could see their placings and times on their mobile devices as they were uploaded, is also a great feature to be able to use.

Another feature used this year was to livestream some of the events to the BMXWA Facebook page, allowing those unable to attend a taste of what was going on throughout the racing. Along with Facebook video BMXWA have current photographers and video expert Reg Sargeant and Andrew Petricevich on hand for snaps and video of the day. All video footage was later uploaded to the PerthBMX YouTube page and photographs are available from PerthBMX website and coming events.

BMXWA would like to thank Westside BMX Club for the fantastic effort put in not only during the event, but also the lead up to the event. Very well done. Those that have hosted State Championships before would understand the enormous time and effort put into maintaining the track and facilities leading up to the event.

A big thank you must also go out to the Volunteers that give up their time, some for the whole event, others assisted throughout the event where they could, and the club volunteers in staging and scoring, from all accounts this ran extremely well.

Onto presentations for the second day and we had another 270 plus trophies to be presented to the 8 year and above categories.

2017 will see the State Championships head to Southside BMX Club in Bullcreek, we look forward to working with the club and members to make this another memorable event.

Northwest Super Series

2016 saw all four clubs in the Pilbara region ready to host another round of the Northwest Series. Entries increasing in the event to well over 200 at each round is fantastic. Officials and members all pitched in to assist in volunteer roles from scoring, staging to canteen helpers and commentators. This is an excellent way for riders in the Pilbara and surrounds to race at other clubs, which is not always possible, due to the great distances between them.



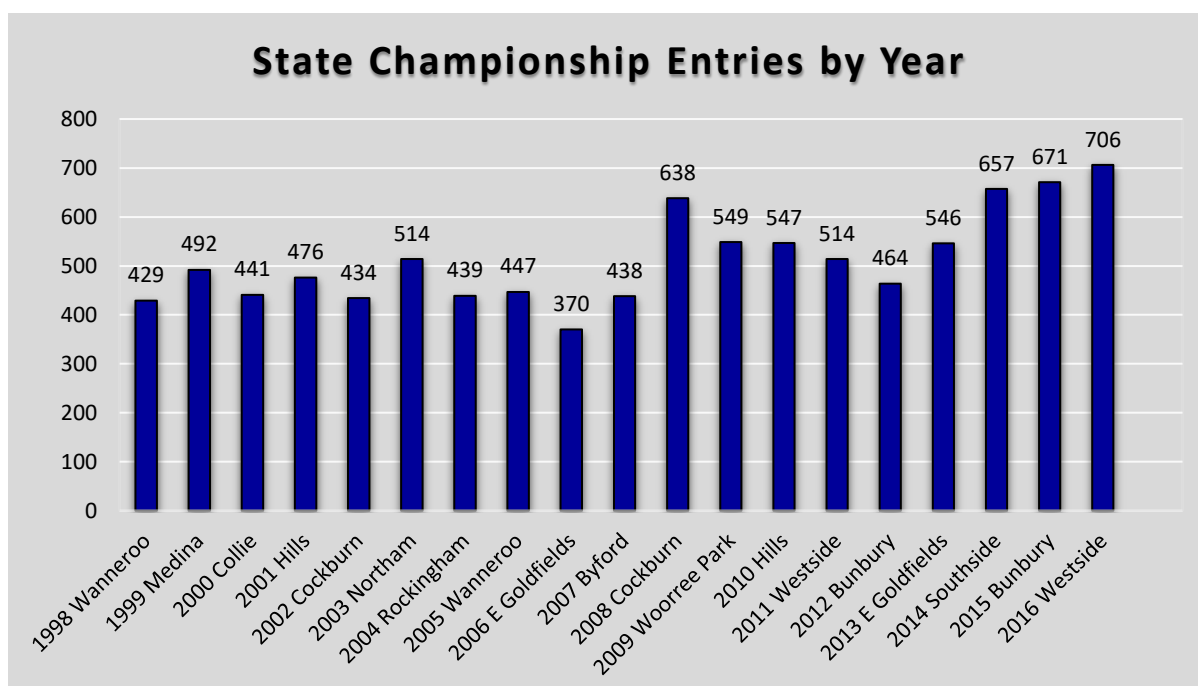
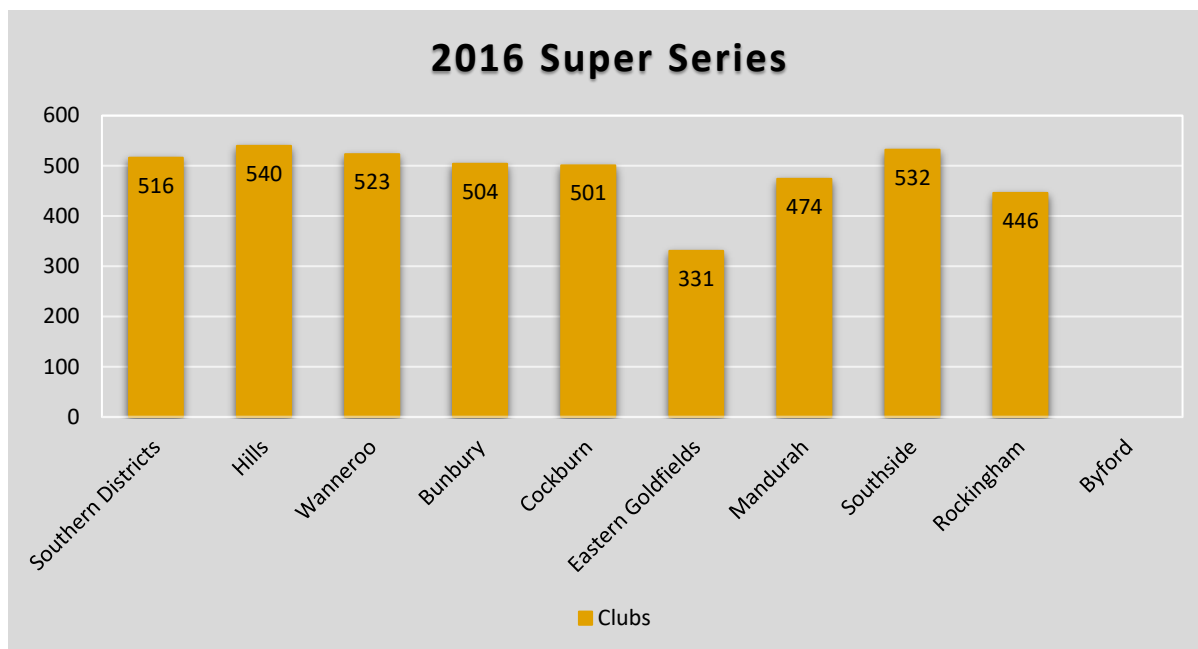

Officials and volunteers are the heart of our Clubs and drive them to succeed and are at all levels from Club up to National level.

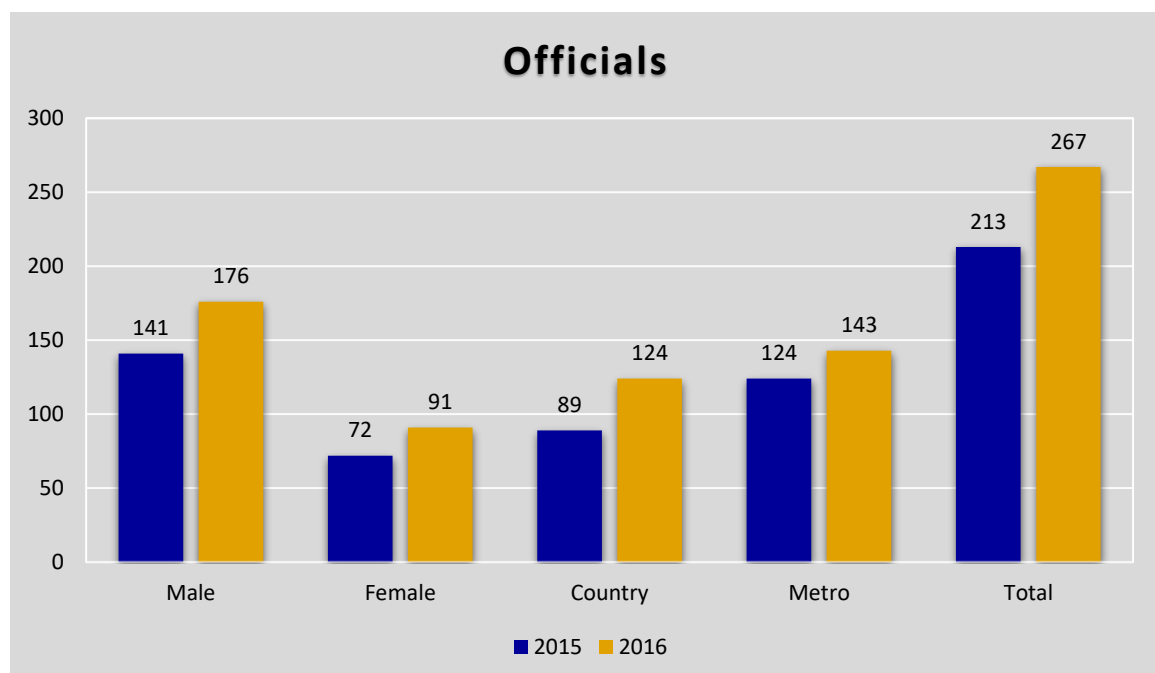
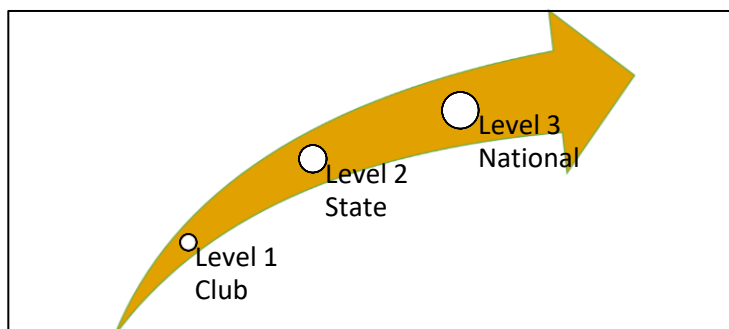

Those interested can then work up to the accreditation for a Level 2 BMX Official which involves a half day course of theory and then another half day of practical before gaining their certificate. Those with the desire and dedication to do so can also work towards gaining a Level 3 National accreditation, with further opportunities to gain World and even Olympic accreditation.

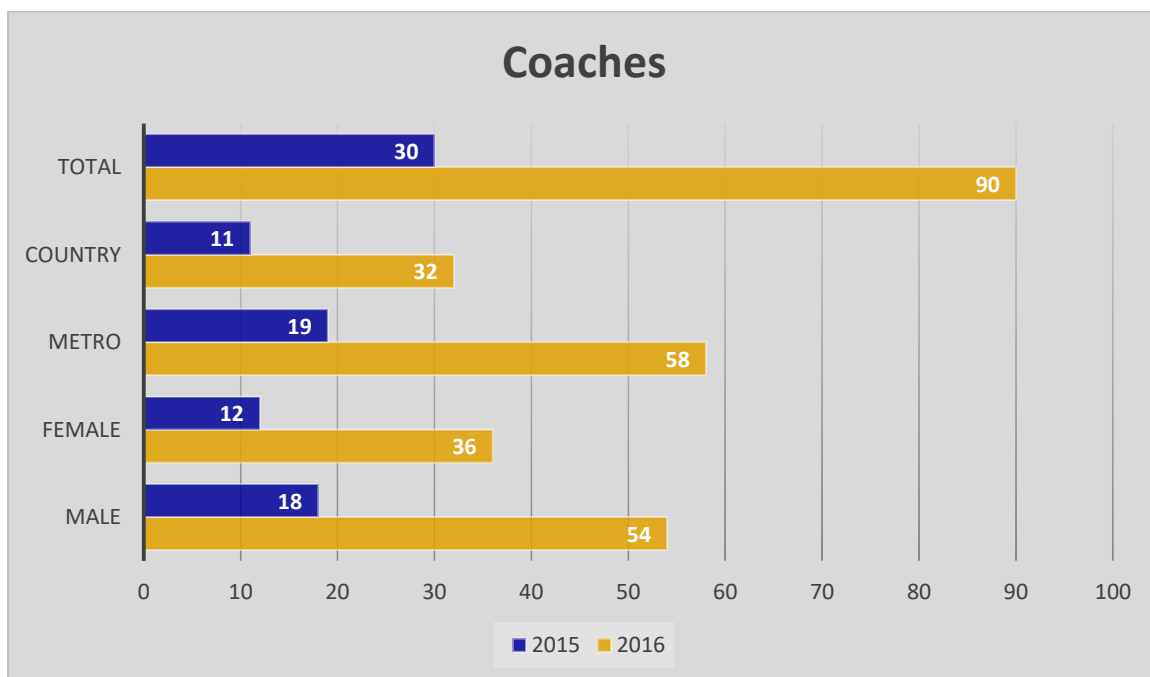

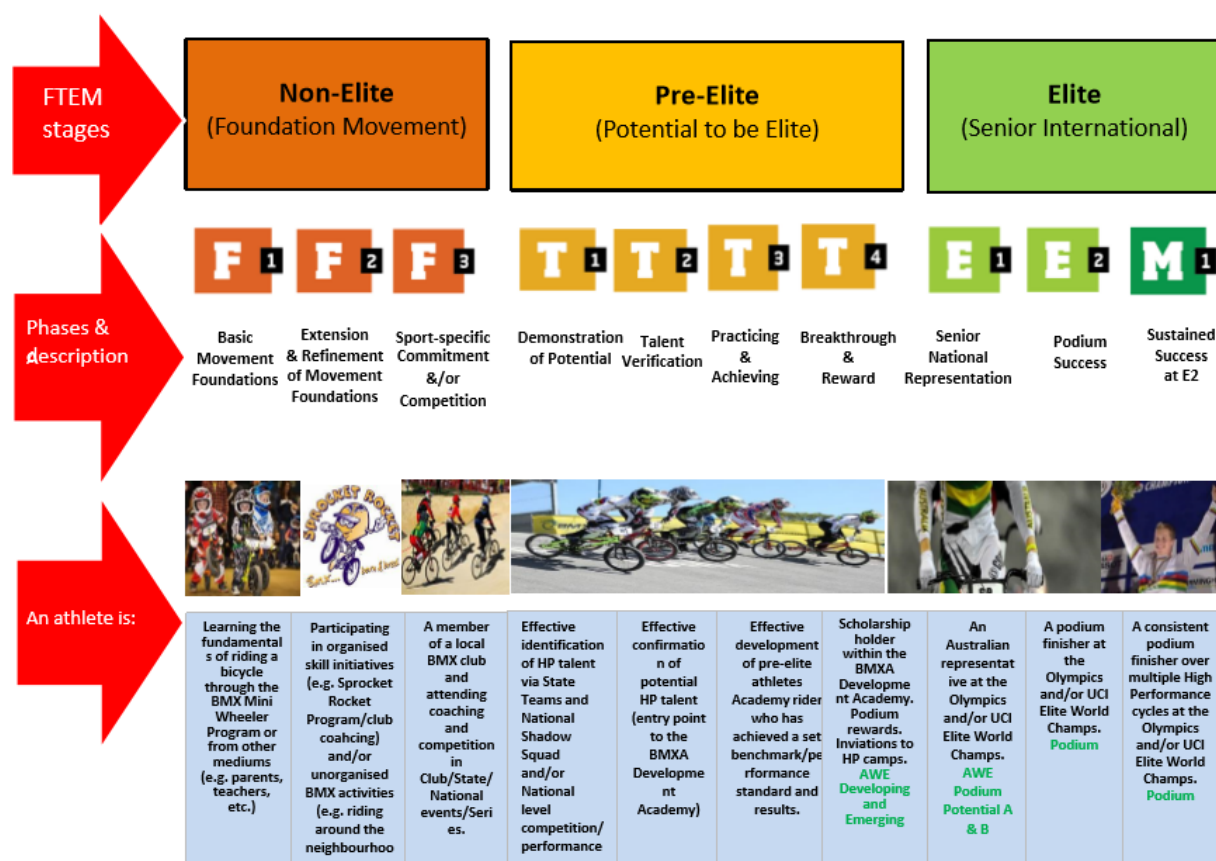

(a) Revenue

(d) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciations and any accumulated impairment losses.

Plant and Equipment

Plant and Equipment is measured on the cost basis.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the board to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to present values determining recoverable amounts.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over their estimated useful lives commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(e) Impairment

Assets with an indefinite useful life are not amortised but are tested annually for impairments in accordance with AASB 136. (g) Employee entitlements

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to the reporting date. Employee entitlements for wages and salaries, annual leave, and long service leave have been measured as follows:

(h) Annual Leave

This benefit is recognised at the reporting date in respect to employees' services up to that date and is measured at the current remuneration rate, applicable to each employee.

(ii) Long Service Leave

Leave benefits are calculated at current remuneration rates and based on the accrued liability to the reporting date. A liability for long service leave has been recognised from the commencement date of each employee based on the need to recognise the contribution to this future expense, from funding received. An actuarial assessment of long service leave has not been undertaken. It is considered that this treatment of the liability for long service leave provides a conservative provision where future funding levels are uncertain.

(iii) Superannuation

BMX Sports Western Australia contributes to superannuation funds of the employee's choice in compliance with the Commonwealth Government's Superannuation Guarantee (Administration) Act 1982. All these funds comply with the legislation applying to administration of superannuation and retirement benefit arrangements, specifically with regard to the preservation of employer contributions and the portability of funds to alternative providers.

(i) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.
