

OPEN DAY FLYER – ENTRY – RULES & GUIDELINES CHECKLIST

Prior to the Event you will need:

Application to Hold Event, Event Flyer, Paper Entry Form, and Event Schedule/Guidelines/Rules will need to be submitted a minimum of eight (8) weeks prior to the event date for approval.

Information listed below **MUST** be displayed on the Flyer/Entry/Guidelines Form before it is approved.

1. Gender Equity Applies
2. Number of Motos & Finals
3. Whichever Ruling, finals are being run under.
4. Voucher (if applicable) and prize pool for ALL Classes
5. Awards (ie, 1st – 3rd)
6. If event is a Money Event – a minimum amount must be displayed on the flyer as per (BMX ARA Rule Book – available on BMX Australia website)
NOTE: No prize money is to be paid unless Riders supplies Log Book (if required)
7. Number of riders that constitute a class (ie: 3 or 4)
8. State on the flyer age for event (ie: Year of Birth)
9. No Alcohol is to be consumed at the event.
10. No Smoking is permitted within the BMX Track vicinity.
11. Scrutineering will be Random at the event.
12. Event entry/registration closing day/time.
13. Practice times to be advertised.
14. Contact Name and Details of person for the event.
15. Postal address for postal entry forms

16. Waiver (must be included)

WAIVER

BMX is a body contact, competitive sport wherein riders on bicycles practice and race according to the rules and regulations of the National Sanctioning Body, BMX Australia Inc., to which this club is affiliated through BMX Sports Western Australia Inc.

Conditions of entry to be signed by all entrants 18 years and over, or the parent/guardian of entrants 17 years and under. Persons entering the BMX Club, its facilities and environment do so at their own risk. BMX Sports WA Inc., The Host Club and its officials, contractors and voluntary workers accept no responsibility for any injury, damage or loss, however incurred, during activities associated with this event.

I give my consent for appropriate medical attention to be given.

In signing this waiver I also agree to abide by the BMX Sports Western Australia Inc Code of conduct.

I am aware that any photographs, still or moving, that may be taken during the event may be published and used for publicity and promotional purposes by BMX Sports Western Australia Inc.

Where the race organiser provides/hires transponders for electronic lap timing, it is the riders's responsibility to ensure that the transponder is correctly fitted to their bike. Transponders must be returned to registration at the conclusion of the event and failure to do so will incur a cost to the rider of \$150 plus costs.

16. Copy of Code of Conduct (may be included)

RIDER/SPECTATOR/PARENT CODE OF CONDUCT

1. Never argue with an Official or Marshall.
2. Ride to enjoy and improve your skills.
3. Co-operate with your co-riders and officials as without them there would be no racing.
4. No rider / parent /spectator is to make offensive, disparaging or insulting remarks about any rider, official, volunteer or spectator.
5. No Rider / Parent / Spectator is to make threats or use physical violence towards any other rider, official, volunteer or spectator.
6. Where an event or competition necessitates accommodation away from the normal residence, including but not restricted to Motels, Hotels, Caravan Parks or any public area, before and after racing hours this code of conduct applies.
7. Riders will be held accountable for the actions of their Parents, other Family Members, and Relations, Team Managers or any other persons in their company at a BMX Competition or Event.
8. No unsportsmanlike behaviour or intentional abuse of equipment will be tolerated.
9. Officials will not tolerate any behaviour or conduct which brings the sport into disrepute.
10. All Riders must be in proper riding attire for all practice and racing. This includes approved helmet & gloves (no ankle socks allowed).
11. Encourage your child to always ride by the rules.
12. Focus upon your Childs efforts and performances, rather than the race result.
13. Assist your child to set realistic goals related to his/her ability and reduce the emphasis on winning.
14. Children learn by example. Applaud good racing by all riders.

15. Do not publicly question an official's judgement, and never their honesty.
16. Recognise the value and importance of all volunteers. Help and support them whenever you can.
17. Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake.
18. The consumption of illegal drugs, performance enhancing or social, by riders / parents / spectators at any BMX Event is prohibited.
19. The consumption of alcohol during any BMX event is prohibited.
20. Officials will report all breaches of the behaviour code, to the BMX Sports Western Australia Board of Management and apply penalties in accordance with the rules.
21. Any complaints that you have about Officials or Riders should be put in writing and submitted to the Board of Management, which will take all accounts into consideration and make a ruling.
22. All BMX Sports Western Australia events will be **SMOKE FREE** events.
23. If a rider is in breach of the above code of conduct at an event he/she will be disqualified from the event.
24. Anybody consuming alcohol during an event will have the rider they are associated with disqualified from the event and both the rider and family will be required to leave the premises immediately.
25. Social Media communications should be restricted to club matters, must not offend, intimidate, humiliate or bully any member or be misleading, false or injure the reputation of members or others. Communications should also seek to protect the privacy of members and must not bring the club or sport into disrepute. Electronic communication regarding people under 18 years of age will be through parents or guardians.

17. Online Nomination Setup and Management can be arranged by BMX Sports Western Australia at a cost of \$255. Please advise if this is required when submitting your application form.

18. ALL Officials (other than Race Director) must be accredited to a minimum of Level 1 Official prior to the event.

Following the Event:

A detailed Race Report for each Event is to be sent to BMX Sports Western Australia no later than fourteen (14) days after the event.

Report to include:

All Officials
Prizemoney Breakdown & Winner Names
First Aid person/s
Incident Report – If anything to report
Comments about the racing.
