PRESIDENT & CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORT

2015 represented another successful year for BMX in Western Australia. From grass roots participation and membership to coaching and officiating, to entries at our State Super Series and State Championships, we have seen success across the board.

EVENTS

Our events calendar continued with its results-proven structured 10 race State Super Series in 2015 beginning in January. Our Super Series continues to see strong entries across all age groups, in particular the mini wheelers with 15-20 at each event as well as 60-75 sprockets consistently through the year. All 9 rounds to date average over 470+ entries at each event. With the final round to go in Northam in November.

Western Australia again secured a round of the BMX Australia National Series held in March and hosted by Westside BMX Club in Balcatta. National Championships headed east to the Sleeman Sports Centre in Queensland with a number of Western Australian riders on the podium, despite the wild weather. The Northwest Clubs continued with their series with another successful year, and East Pilbara BMX Club coming on board this year for the first time, which allowed a total of 4 rounds to be completed.

2015 State Championships moved to regional WA this year at the Bunbury BMX Club with a record number of entries topping 670+. The weekend proved to be a fantastic success with perfect weather over the 3 day event. The Club did a magnificent job with track and surrounds in pristine condition.

On a more social level, our end of years awards function will enter a new era with the event moving to Adventure World in Bibra Lake. This move will enable the event to grow and be available to more families as we had outgrown the previous venue, consistently being sold-out out, with over 600 riders and their families in the past attending the ceremony. We hope this new bigger venue will attract more riders and families to celebrate the year and award the age group trophies for the Super Series.

CLUB DEVELOPMENT

BMX Sports Western Australia, in partnership with the Department of Sport & Recreation, has continued to implement the Healthy Club Online checklist for clubs, allowing them to complete as a group and then receive a detailed report outlining each Club's strengths and weaknesses. This in turn allows the State Association and DSR to also understand where they can best assist clubs, with future planning, policies and guidelines and development.

BMXWA have also been working with the clubs in the Northwest of the state as well as Eastern Goldfields to support the development of each club's strategic and operational plans.

Of particular note we welcome back to the BMXWA family the East Pilbara BMX Club, based in Newman. A successful club in the 80's, the site lay dormant for many years until a group of very enthusiastic local residents banded together to bring the club back to its former glory and beyond. They have since hosted a round of the North West Series and should be congratulated for their hard work.

VOLUNTEER RECOGNITION

For 2015 BMXWA continue the initiative of volunteer recognition for our Volunteers at both Club and State level. We understand that without the help of volunteers we would not be able to operate. Club and Super Series volunteers will be recognised at the upcoming annual awards event.



SUPER SERIES VOLUNTEERS

Volunteer duties continue to be part of the 2015 Super Series. It is fantastic to see parents and guardians taking part in their volunteer roles at BMX events. Every rider wishing to qualify for 2015 Super Series must provide a volunteer for a minimum of 2 x motos over the course of the season. A register of volunteers is kept by BMXWA. At the end of 2015 Super Series Season year all volunteer names will go into the draw to win a full year of Super Series fees paid to the value of \$200. To be drawn at Annual Awards Event. The award for 2013/14 Bryson Stewart from Woorree Park BMX Club.

COACHING

With the consolidation of the Beginners Coaching course, to date we have 12 newly accredited Beginner Coaches and another course booked for late October. Some of our Beginner coaches are also aspiring to further their training by moving to the next level of becoming a BMX Level 1 accredited coach. Our aim for BMX and the clubs is to be able to have a minimum number of coaches in every club to be able to service the number of new and existing riders coming through. It is great to be able to offer all members training and coaching, as well as racing.

ONLINE LICENCING AND ELECTRONIC MEDIA

With the IMG online membership licencing and event system being superseded by the new OSM system, WA Clubs have now transitioned with over 98% using the online system to become new or renewing members. BMXWA will continue to develop our online newsletters and information to all our members through the new system. With continued improvements to online eventing nominations, we have now been using an electronic version for over 4 years and have over 99% using online to register for events. Our paper nomination forms for events are almost a thing of the past. The new system has also allowed us to build volunteer job events online as part of the volunteering requirements, all volunteers can now become members and sign up prior to each event with the click of a button. This has proved a big hit already after only a few times.

With regard to the electronic media, BMXWA has continued to maintain a strong presence with Facebook as a key platform in our online and social media communications, where up to the minute information on races, links to results, videos and all things BMX locally and internationally are posted. To date we have 719 'likes' to the page which is a 46.7% increase since 2013. With over 4000 people viewing the page in the last week alone. In addition race day videos of the Super Series and State Championships are being posted via You Tube by the PerthBMX Channel.



ATHLETE DEVELOPMENT

With the ongoing development of this program, we saw 9 riders being selected for the State Athlete Development Squad and 9 riders being selected for the High Performance Squad for 2014/15. Travelling to some of the events as a squad together was definitely a learning curve for all of us. Invitations to National testing camps meant some of our Athletes were able to learn and experience what it is like to train and practice at the Elite level. The BMXWA Board have also agreed to continue the support for the upcoming season of 2015/16 with both Athlete Development and High Performance squads.

In addition our riders performed admirably on the world stage in particularly our Elite riders in the UCI BMX Supercross World Cup. Lauren Reynolds had a very consistent year with an overall 9th place in the Elite Women and a best result of 3rd in Angelholm and 5th in Papendal. Meanwhile Kirsten Dellar made it to the 'show' on a couple of occasions - notably finishing 5th in her semi-final at Angelholm, Sweden. WA was also represented in the Elite Men with Brad Game continuing his strong form in the past two seasons, also making the show in Angelholm, Sweden. Brad Game and Rachelle Smith were also selected along with Lauren Reynolds to represent Australia at the World Championships in Zolder, Belgium.

BMX MINI WHEELERS

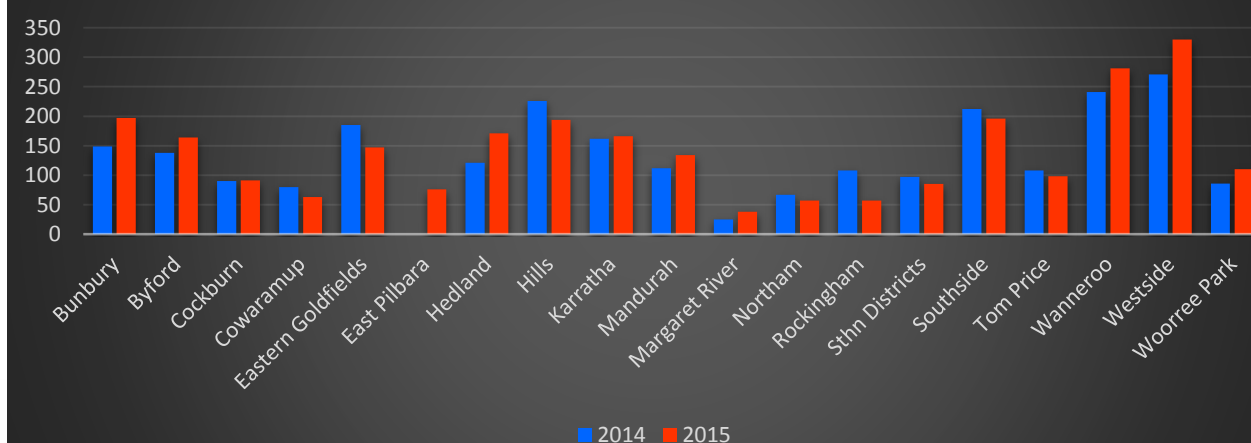
BMX Mini-Wheelers are continuing to achieve great success at clubs and refinement of the format has seen this grow to a legitimate class in all clubs throughout the state. To date WA has approximately 240 registered mini wheelers, some participating in rounds of the Super Series and also featured at the State Championships at Bunbury. Of note is the specially designed mini-wheeler start gate which holds 4 riders and comes complete with a foot controlled starting mechanism.



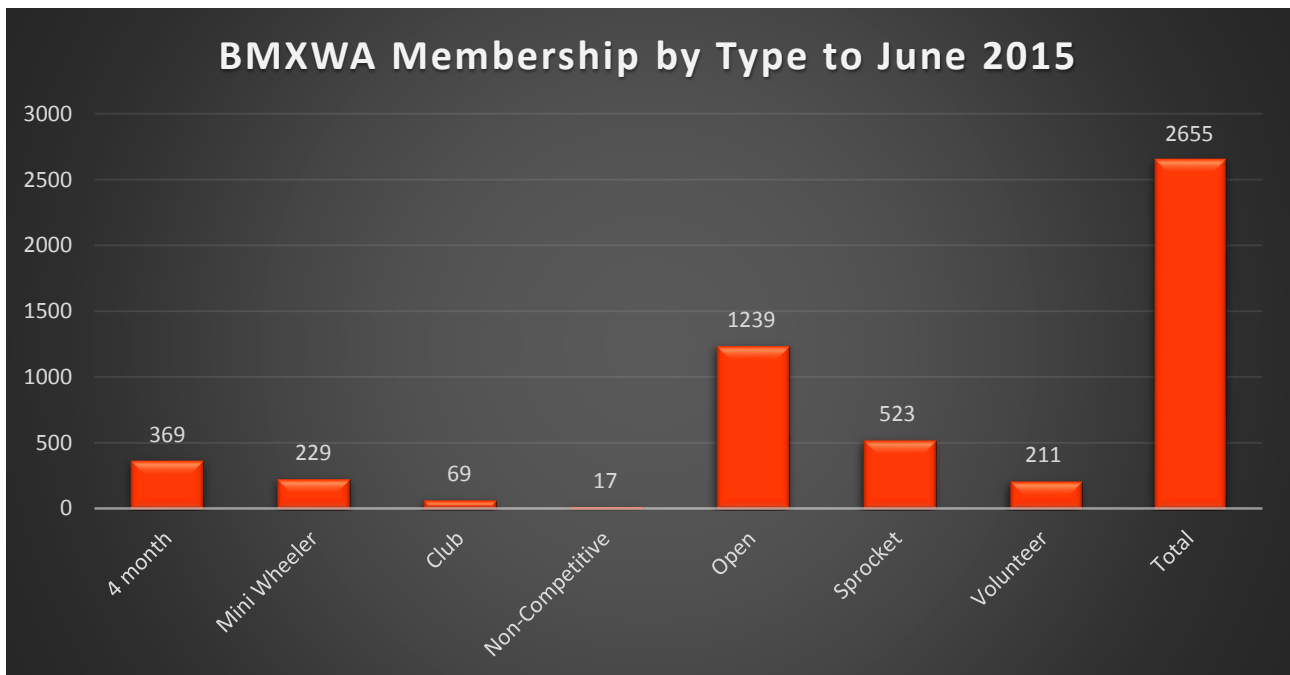
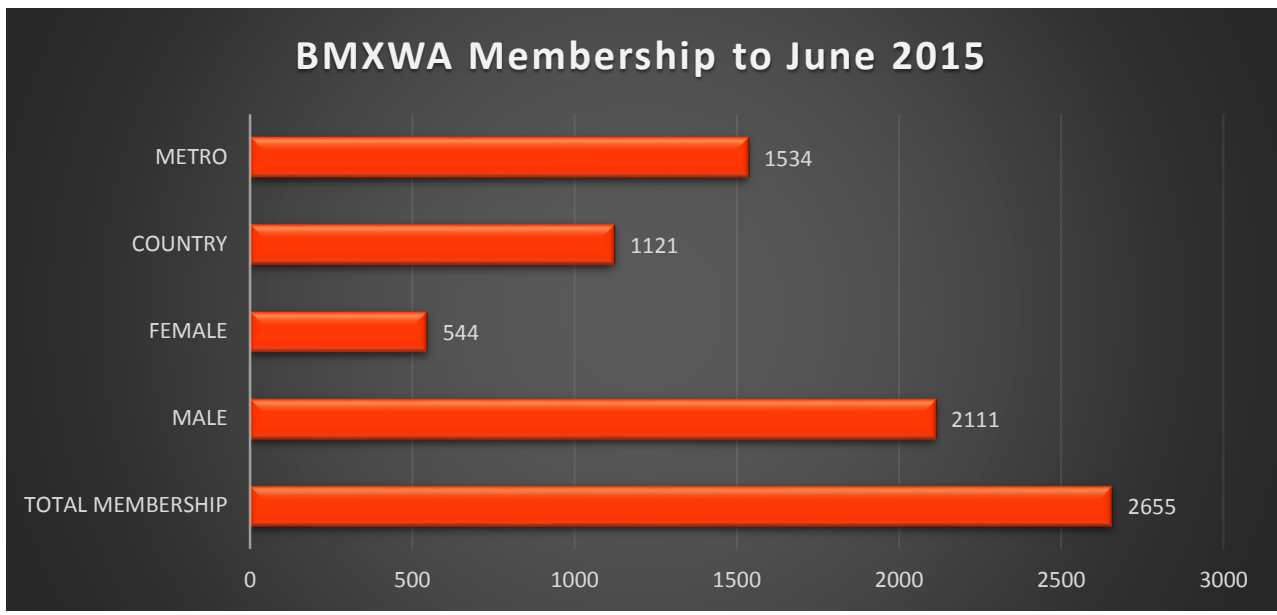

EVENT REPORT

National Series 2015

The 2015 season kicked off with round 1 & 2 of the BMX Australia National Probikx/Champbikx & Challenge Series heading off to the traditional host track at Nerang in Queensland. With a large contingent of 14 years and over riders from WA heading across the paddock to race for glory in the first big race of the year. Nerang again turned on some very warm weather, along with the high humidity in typical Queensland weather. Kirsten Dellar taking out 2nd spot after the 2 day event, along with Lauren Reynolds in number 3 for Elite Women. Riley Carter in the 15 Boys class took out another podium position with 2nd place. In the 14 boys age group we saw Dylan Bennetts hold onto 3rd spot. With the now recently introduced challenge classes we saw Kishani Green come home with 2nd place in the 17+ Womens Class.

Probikx/Champbikx is a fantastic initiative that allows the 14 and over age group of riders to race in a standalone series (9 rounds this year) around the country in the months prior to National Championships. Events are classed as C1 UCI events which also allows International riders to attend and give the Australian riders a taste of what is out there around the World. We saw a good number of New Zealand riders attend these events in the 2015 season.

Shepparton played host to round 3 & 4, and again we saw some very warm weather. A smaller group of WA riders headed to the East Coast to again try their luck. With around 210 entries, the races were going to run through quickly, so all riders had to be on their game.

Rounds 5 & 6 saw WA riders taking a break from the long haul to be hosted at home by Westside BMX Club in Balcatta. This gave home grown riders that generally would not travel a glance into the big league as riders from across the country and world and again a flood of NZ riders swoop in on WA to try and gain some valuable points needed towards the series. WA rider Rachelle Smith in the Junior Women came in a very close 2nd place to Zoe Flemming who had been on fire at previous events earlier in the year. Lauren Reynolds was on point all day to take out 1st Place in Elite women on the first day, and then did it all again on the second day and held onto 1st place again. Kirsten Dellar was at ease on her home track to take on both Reynolds and Buchannan picking up 3rd place on day 1. Home grown knowledge was on target for Dylan Bennetts in the 14 boys to take out 2nd place in round 5, and then knock off his counterpart to take home the blue ribbon 1st place on day 2. Another two riders racing well on the weekend were 15 boys Riley Carter 2nd place and Joel Flower who was on the podium as well with 3rd place. Local rider Kyle Green took another spot by placing 3rd in the 16 boys. Challenge classes were also dominated by WA riders with Matthew Tongue reigning in 1st place in the 17-29 Men, and Airlie Gooden picking up a 2nd in the 17+ Women's class.

BMXWA will continue to bid for rounds of the National Series each year to bring the high class events to WA, allowing all WA riders the chance to race against some of the best around. It is a stepping stone in the BMX pathway to gain valuable results and for riders looking to gain selection into the National Squads.



National Series 2015

Cairns BMX Club in Queensland was to play host to round 7 & 8 with similar numbers to that of Westside a few weeks before. The Elite & Junior Women's classes were combined, and we saw Rachelle Smith (JW) take on Sarah Harvey to come out with 2nd place on day 1 and then top the list with a 1st place on the second day. With a group of 17 riders, Dylan Bennetts again proved his worth taking out yet another podium spot for 3rd place in round 7. And Riley Carter with a 2nd place in 15 Boys. Kyle Green was again to gain a 3rd spot on day 1. The Challenge class 17+ Women put Airlie Gooden in 1st place over the weekend and Kishani Green a close 3rd place in the same race and day 1. Another Challenge class the 30+ Masters, with Jade McPherson holding onto 3rd spot.

Round 9 in some very trying conditions and the final round stepped up a notch to head to the big 8m ramp at Sleeman, held on the Thursday evening before National Championships. This round was also to double as a UCI Oceania Championships for the Probikx riders. Lauren Reynolds again proved too strong for the field to finish in 3rd place for Elite Women. Rachelle Smith taking home 3rd place in the Junior Women. Kishani Green held onto 3rd place in the 17+ Women. At the end of the series Lauren Reynolds took home the number one position for Elite Women to beat Caroline Buchannan by 10 points, Rachelle Smith in Junior Women 2nd place overall, Riley Carter 1st place for 15 Boys, Airlie Gooden in the 17+ Women with 2nd place, Jade McPherson in the 30+ Masters with 3rd place.

Congratulations to ALL WA riders that entered into the National Series, and they now get ready to do it all again in 2016.

2015 State Super Series

The State Super Series for 2015 took off in January, with a trip to Eastern Goldfields (Kalgoorlie), part of a 10 round series for 2015 it was going to be a big year travelling the State to gain valuable experience and racing against the best riders in WA.

With most clubs that are part of the Super Series all now hard wired for the electronic scoring system, the old way of manual scoring is pretty much a thing of the past for Super Series events. Most riders have also purchased their own dedicated transponders which are the timing chips used to score each individual rider at the events. A good number of clubs have also followed suit and purchased transponder timing systems to allow them to score electronically at club days and nights throughout the year. A valuable tool for all riders, enabling them to see lap race times. Uploading almost instantly of times and race details is also something that has become part of a normal race day, no longer do riders have to wait days to see full results and times. A dedicated group of officials and an even bigger group of parent/guardian volunteers assist throughout the year to make sure all events are run smoothly. Their valuable help at these events goes without saying, they would not run without them.

Online nominations have almost completely done away with the old manual paperwork, allowing a fast instant way to enter the events for all riders, giving them an instant receipt, and also to view other riders entered in the same race.

BMXWA continued to see growth in numbers across all rounds of the State Super Series, with numbers increasing hugely in our sprocket classes in the past few years to around 80 each event.

BMXWA has also introduced in 2015 with the assistance of the online nomination system a Volunteers event, which can list all available positions for a race day and enable them to select one of them well prior to the event day. These volunteer jobs form part of the criteria for riders to qualify at the end of the year awards ceremony. All level 1 and above officials can now register their interest online with ease.

Continued training on the computer scoring program BEM and transponders, along with upskilling officials to Level 2 accreditation happens throughout the year at events around the State.

All Clubs that have hosted a round of the State Series this year have done an exceptional job, and should be congratulated. The hours of track preparation is enormous. Running of the canteens to enable good healthy food at all events is another mammoth task on the day and in preparation beforehand.

The final round for the year will see riders head to Northam in November, before the annual Awards Ceremony in December to crown the State Series winners for the year. 2016 will be another very busy year for National rounds with the Olympics moving most events forward.



2015 State Championships

Bunbury BMX Club had won the bid and played host to the BMX Sports Western Australia State Championships in October. With record numbers of entries, and the event changed days and moved to the second week of school holidays, we were in luck not to clash with the AFL Grand Finals.

Bunbury had hosted the event back in 2012, but a mostly new Club Committee, now have the valuable insight in how to prepare for big events, after months of planning and preparation. Bunbury had also made their track available in the months leading up to the event, and most clubs and individual riders took advantage to dial in the track prior to the big event.

With two Pre State events hosted by Bunbury the week before the big event, it gave riders another chance to spend some time on the track. Thursday official practice and registration was just the start of the 3 day event.

Day one of the main event and we had the opening ceremony ready to go, with VIP in place including members of parliament, local government, sports departments and others, we were treated to the Welcome to Country speech by Delys Walton, next on the cards was local singing talent Codee-Lee who sang a beautiful version of the National Anthem. With the formalities over and the event officially opened by the Federal Member for Forrest, Mrs Nola Marino it was time to get the proceedings underway.

Mini Wheelers were the first cab off the rank, with young riders from 2-4 years of age, with helmets sometimes bigger than they are and making their way around a small part of the track on their balance bikes, they would steal the hearts of all the crowd. Cameras were flashing from all points of the track. Mini Wheelers are now a major part of BMX Racing in WA and Australia, they are the grassroots starting point for bike riding. And no we didn't make them go down the 6m ramp.

Mini Wheelers done and it was time for their trophy presentations, they were ushered off the track much to their disgust as some would have kept going all day around and around. Again we put Mrs Nola Marino to work presenting the awards to the young Mini Wheeler riders, their eyes beaming at the sight of the shiny trophies and parents wanting another special moment shot of their upcoming stars.

Sprockets and Cruisers would be next to hit the track, full speed ahead for the race day ahead. Riders from around the State had travelled to enter the pinnacle of BMX in Western Australia and race for that number one spot.

Numbers for the junior class of sprockets had again hit record highs, with more numbers in the 4 sprockets classes than almost any other age class. Sprocket girl numbers had hit the high teens, proving the sport of BMX is no longer seen as a male dominant sport.

Sprocket classes being a participation class only, still battled it out for that top spot all day, where we will see some great riders jumping up into the eight year old class next year, switching over to points scoring for the first time in their young careers.

Cruisers on the gate, and for some riders it would give them the chance to dial in the track for another day ahead of the main twenty inch classes on Saturday. With the weather heating up slightly, great battles were fought all day in the bigger wheeled cruiser classes. The older age classes also put on a fantastic show, racing as hard in the finals as they ever had before to look forward to taking home the coveted number one trophy.

The race day was ended off on the track with another practice session for the age class riders, ready for the next day's racing. Trophies were presented to all sprocket and cruiser classes and it was time for the winning smiles to come out for photo sessions.

The second day of racing saw the weather with similar conditions, although slightly warmer than most riders were used to, but they were all up for the challenge.

The parade of riders from all Clubs is always a sea of colours, each club get to march in their club colours with their club members and be judged for the prestigious award of Best Presented Club. This year the award was taken out by Eastern Goldfields in blue and gold club colours.

The Best Represented Club award went to Hills BMX Club. Next on the program was the 10/15 and we even had a 20 year award this year. Presented to those that have completed consecutive years in a row of State Championships. What an excellent achievement 20 years in a row and Blake is still racing around the track as keen as ever.

The age class twenty inch riders were next to hit the track, with all eyes waiting to see the Elite riders soaring over the berm jump. The track is both challenging and technical for all age groups, which was going to bring out the best of the best in WA riders at the end of the day.

Electronic timing locked and ready to go so everyone could see their placings and times on their mobile devices as they were uploaded, is a great feature to be able to use.

With the introduction of tent land, when riders were not on the track they were able to visit the many Pro Shops and vendors that were on site, ready with a bargain for them to purchase. A vast array of food was also available from the mobile food hall that was bought in to keep everyone happy.

BMXWA would like to thank the Bunbury BMX Club for the fantastic effort put in not only during the event, but also the lead up to the event. Very well done.

A big thankyou must also go out to the Volunteers that give up their time, some for the whole event, others assisted throughout the event where they could, and the club volunteers in staging, from all accounts this ran extremely well.

Onto presentations and we had an outcome that has not happened in the near past to our knowledge, 13 Boys had two 1st Place winners, and if that wasn't strange enough, the 50+ class also had two 1st place winners. Teams both Corporate and Club Family were another big success this year, with again another tie for 3rd place in the corporate team awards.

2016 will see the State Championships head to Westside BMX Club in Balcatta, we look forward to working with the club and members to make this another memorable event.

Northwest Super Series

This year saw the introduction of a fourth club added to the North West Super Series, with East Pilbara coming on board, as a brand new club re-affiliated after some ten years. Karratha, Tome Price, Hedland officials and members all pitched in to assist in their inaugural round. With entries up around the 200 mark at each event, it is a fantastic way for riders in the Pilbara to race at other clubs, which is not always possible, due to the sheer distance between them.

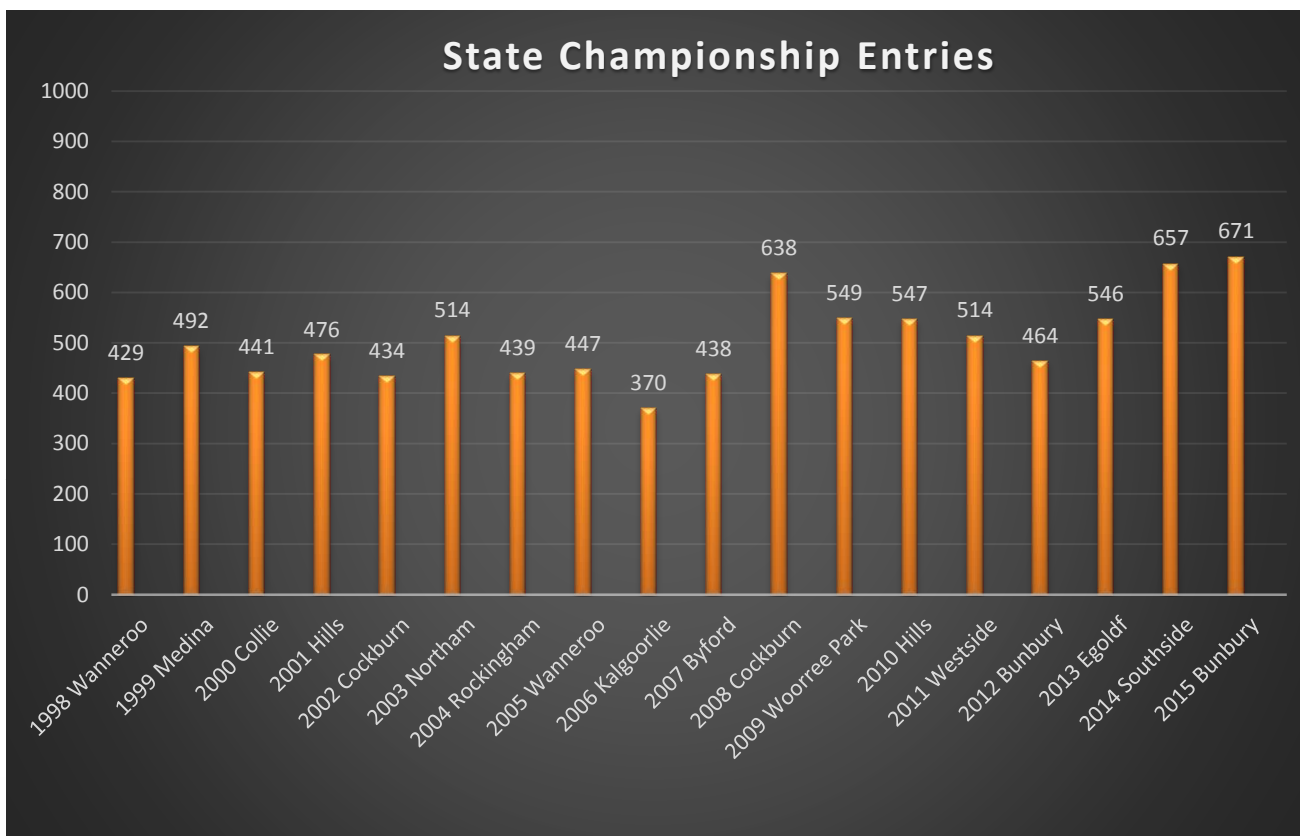
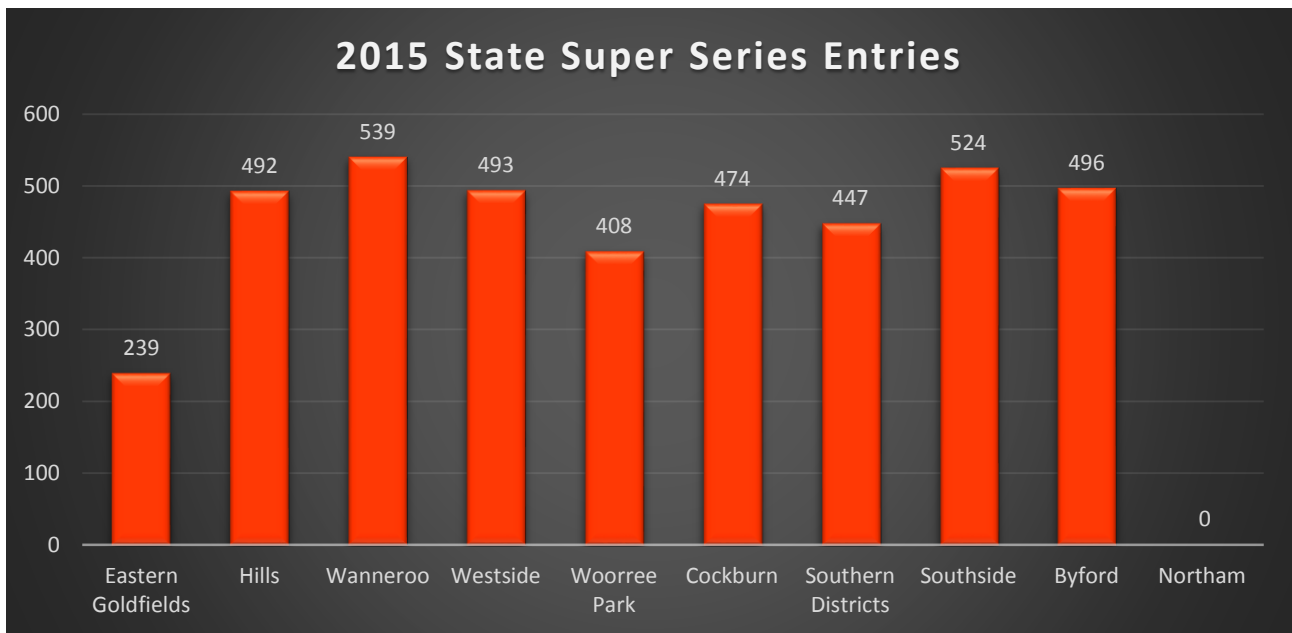

Officials and volunteers are what drives our Clubs to succeed and they make up the heart of our sport, at all levels from Club up to National level.

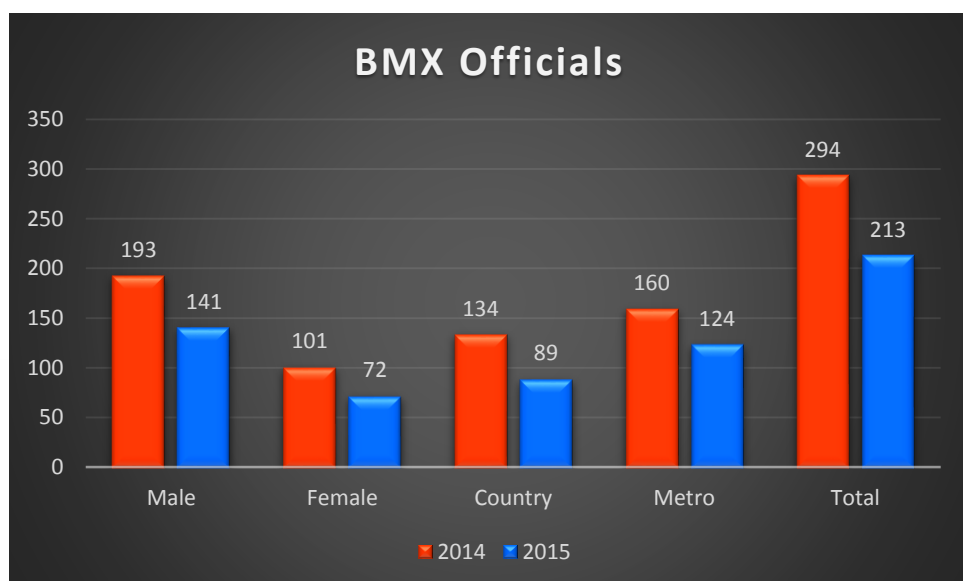
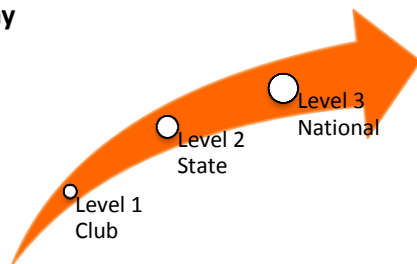

Those with the desire and dedication to do so can also work towards gaining a Level 3 National accreditation, with further opportunities to gain World and even Olympic accreditation.

Officials Pathway

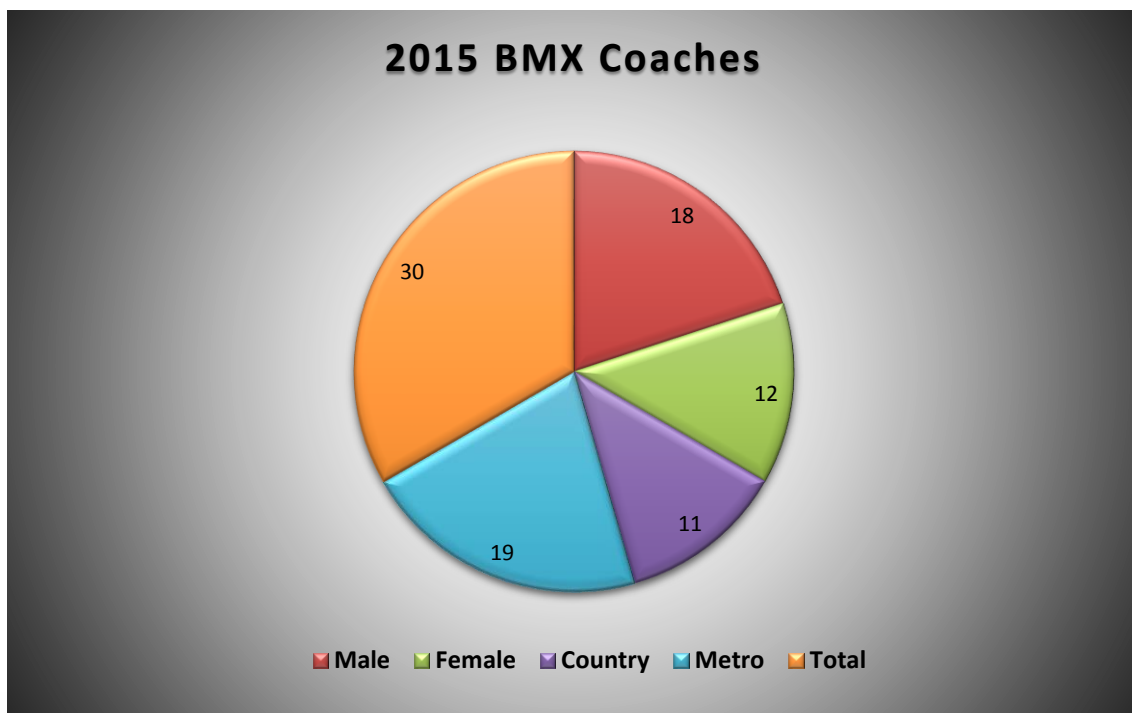


COACHES

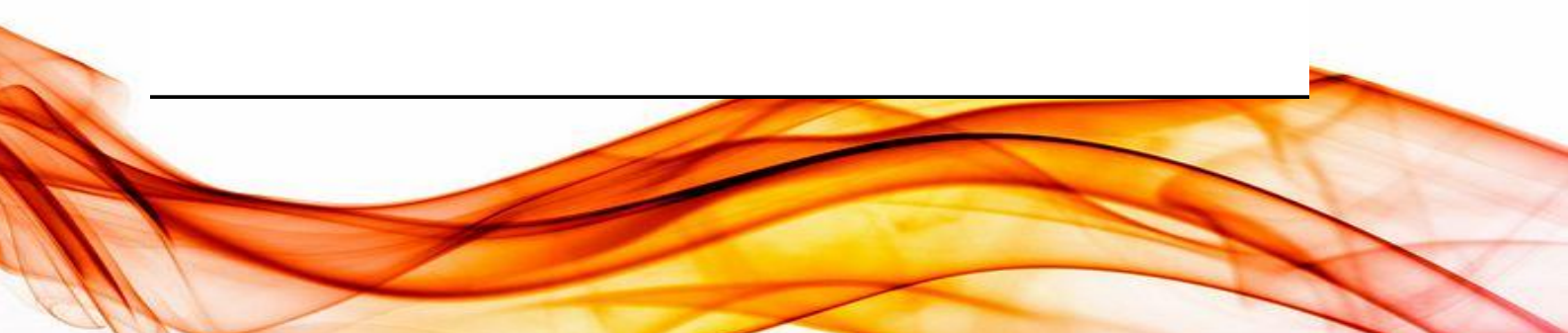

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial report preparation requirements of the *Associations Incorporations Act 1987 (WA)*. The board has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs, which do not take into account changing money values or, except when specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The financial report was approved by the board as at the date of the board report.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report.

(a) Revenue

Revenue from sale of goods is recognised when the significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods have passed to the buyer and the costs incurred or to be incurred in respect of the transactions can be measured reliably. Risks and rewards of ownership are considered passed to the buyer at the time of delivery of the goods to the customer.

Revenue from the rendering of services is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST)

(b) Government Grants

Government grants are recognised at fair value when there is reasonable certainty that the grant will be received and all grant conditions met. Grants relating to expense items are recognised as income over the periods necessary to match the grant to the costs they are compensating.

(c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand and at banks, cash management and term deposits with an original maturity date of five months or less held at call with financial institutions.

(d) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciations and any accumulated impairment losses.

Plant and Equipment

Plant and Equipment is measured on the cost basis.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the board to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to present values determining recoverable amounts.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over their estimated useful lives commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(e) Impairment

Assets with an indefinite useful life are not amortised but are tested annually for impairments in accordance with AASB 136. Assets subject to annual depreciation or amortisation are reviewed for impairment whenever events or circumstances arise that indicates that the carrying amount of the asset may be impaired.

An impairment loss is recognised where the carrying amount of the asset exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount of an asset is defined as the higher of its fair value less costs to sell and value in use.

(f) Leases

The only leases currently operated through BMX Sports Western Australia are leases for the purpose of the use of office space.

(g) Employee entitlements

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to the reporting date. Employee entitlements for wages and salaries, annual leave, and long service leave have been measured as follows:

(h) Annual Leave

This benefit is recognised at the reporting date in respect to employees' services up to that date and is measured at the current remuneration rate, applicable to each employee.

(ii) Long Service Leave

Leave benefits are calculated at current remuneration rates and based on the accrued liability to the reporting date. A liability for long service leave has been recognised from the commencement date of each employee based on the need to recognise the contribution to this future expense, from funding received. An actuarial assessment of long service leave has not been undertaken. It is considered that this treatment of the liability for long service leave provides a conservative provision where future funding levels are uncertain.

(iii) Superannuation

BMX Sports Western Australia contributes to superannuation funds of the employee's choice in compliance with the Commonwealth Government's Superannuation Guarantee (Administration) Act 1982. All these funds comply with the legislation applying to administration of superannuation and retirement benefit arrangements, specifically with regard to the preservation of employer contributions and the portability of funds to alternative providers.

(i) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

(j) Comparatives

Comparative figures have been enclosed in this financial report.

(k) Rounding of amounts

Amounts in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.
